Barbara Mather, a former PAWS president for many years, passed away on December 20, 2019 after a long battle with Alzheimers. Working with animal rescue was a very important part of her life. She devoted many years to heading up PAWS, which included our years at 95 Walnut Street, raising funds for the 77 North Willow Street building, then seeing the facility through to completion and making the move. Barbara worked in the financial industry as a broker in Manhattan firms before working for many years for the Martin Family Fund at their Saddle River office. Every day after work she would come to the shelter and manage all there was to do there: piles of paperwork; dealing with employees, volunteers and prospective adopters; and helping provide care for the innumerable animals that came into PAWS shelter. She wrote once that she took the job of President mainly because nobody else wanted it and figured there would not be meetings involved, but found out just how much work was involved in running PAWS. After we moved out of the shelter building in 2008, she continued to be involved in the rescue and placement of the animals. It was only after her third heart-valve replacement that she was forced to retire and limit her activities. Barbara was very devoted to PAWS, and we appreciate and remember her for carrying out our mission with amazing efficiency and dedication.

with a deformed colon causing many bowel issues and discomfort for her when she first arrived. We brought her to several vets who thought she had a condition called "megacolon" and put her on various supplements and dietary restrictions. After no improvement, we sought the expertise of specialists who were able to determine and solve the problem. Kitty Purry underwent a major surgery to reconstruct her colon allowing her to have proper bowel function. She is missing one of the major muscles which could cause her to have "accidents." Since this surgery, they have been very few and seldom. She does remain on a specialized diet. She is a remarkable little girl who is just an absolute love bug, very playful and snuggly yet independent. She will do fine as a single cat or in a multi cat household. Kitty Purry is truly a special kitty and is so happy now! Additionally, she is spayed and current on her vaccines.



Cupcake is an adult, tuxedo female with a stubby tail. She is shy at first, but is very sweet when she gets to know you. She's a quiet, laidback girl who is up for strokes and purrs, though she is not friendly with other cats. She would do well in a home with no children and no other pets. Cupcake has been spayed, vaccinated, dewormed, and is FIV/FeLV negative."



Bianca was rescued by PAWS from an over-crowded rural shelter where, due to her breed, her only way out was to be rescued. Bianca is one of the sweetest dogs ever, and we just don't understand why she hasn't garnered more interest. Her foster, Rich, takes great care of her and says she would be a great dog for just about any home. Bianca is about 60 lbs., friendly -- loves everyone -- and is friendly with other dogs. She may be fine with cats as well as she's submissive. She just wants to be safe. She is healthy and young, about 3 years old, and gorgeous.

Molly had been tearfully surrendered to an inner city pound by a family due to landlord issues. Molly looks like a cross between a very small pittie and a Boston terrier. She had a cherry eye which has



been surgically corrected, and has a unique look with her one blue eye and one brown eye. Molly will do well in an active home. She is very spirited and will benefit from some leash training. Spayed, housebroken, she just needs a stable home where she can decompress.

Levi is a sweet, affectionate, mellow boy, about 2 years old. He was found on the street in East Orange with a tattered collar so we assume he was a lost, or dumped, family cat. He's ready to become the mushiest and sweetest member of your family! Levi adores everyone and is the



kindest soul. We would like Levi to either be adopted together with another cat or go to a home with at least one other cat since he adores them. He might love dogs, too, but we haven't tested him with any. Neutered, UTD on shots, FeLV/FIV negative.

family and enjoys life with her sister Cinnamon.



#### Helping animals and people

PAWS Montclair prioritizes helping animals in need and people in our local community. We pull at-risk animals from kill shelters and other bad situations, help people rehome their pets, and answer daily emails and phone calls from the community. We do adoption events weekly, speak at schools regarding the plight of homeless animals, organize and run two successful large fundraisers yearly, along with multiple smaller scale fundraisers throughout the year. All of our rescues are thoroughly vetted and spayed or neutered. Recently we had the good fortune to be invited to a radio station to showcase two of our dogs, bringing visibility to them as well as PAWS.

#### Two of This Year's Rescues

Black Eyed Pea was found searching for food on a stifling hot July night, alone, filthy and desperate for a morsel of food. He narrowly escaped being hit by cars as he dodged traffic on Route 280. Once he made his way across the highway, a kind, cat-loving gentlemen saw him, and pulled him out of harm's way.



PAWS was contacted and assumed the care of Pea. The vet evaluated him and despite having terrible ear mites and mild conjunctivitis, he initially appeared to be otherwise healthy. However, during the exam, the vet noticed that he had a rapid and overwhelmingly hard heartbeat and recommended a cardiology consult. Upon examination by the cardiologist, we made a plan to repair the problematic valve of his heart. Mitrovalve prolapse is caused when the exit valve of the heart is underdeveloped, causing the valve to be unable to close off at appropriate time, which then allows a backflow of blood and possible bacteria to enter the heart chamber, and is a very expensive procedure. But PAWS did not want to give up on this amazingly resilient kitten, and we were able to cover the bills. Black Eye Pea came through the surgery amazingly well and is able to have a normal life now. He is in great foster care and awaits his forever home.



Gigi, a lab-pit mix, came to PAWS from a crowded municipal shelter. She stayed at the kennel we use as we had no open foster homes, and she was doing well. Sweet and loving, Gigi won the hearts of the kennel staff. We noticed she had a small lump at the top of her left leg, and we made a vet appointment to have it examined. In a short time, the lump had grown considerably and was affecting Gigi's gait,

and she was unable to put weight on the leg. Our vets did some diagnostics and felt amputation was the only way to stop this soft tissue mass from continuing to grow and hopefully be curative. Today, Gigi is thriving as a "tripod" and has been adopted into a wonderful home with Dorian and Anna.

These are just two of the cases we had this year. Every rescue is important to us, and we provide whatever each one needs.



In looing memory of Ciper Two weeks before Christmas last year, our beloved and beautiful girl Piper passed away due to multiple health issues, including a large mass on her liver. Her foster dad, Rich, did an amazing job keeping her comfortable and loved throughout her stay with him, and we all mourned her loss. Piper was pulled by PAWS from AHS Newark last year. She was in rough shape, an older pittie who had obvious-

ly lived a tough life. She had few teeth, and the ones she had were ground down to nubs. We are thankful that we were able to give her the love and care she so deserved. Our supporters give us the chance to help dogs like Piper, the ones who are lost in the system. The resiliency of these sweet souls is amazing.

#### Fostering saves lives!

Christine is one of our amazing long-time fosterers. Busy wife and mom to three teenage boys, three dogs, and caregiver to her ailing mother, she still gracefully fosters, and helped place all these dogs this past year. She works with them to help us adopt them into the best homes possible suited to each dog. We are blessed to have her on our team, as are the dogs she brings into her home. #### **\$\$ CASH FOR CRITTERS \$\$**

Collect empty ink jet and laser cartridges, and old cell phones. PAWS will be paid up to \$4 (\$2 for most ink jets). Based on styles, PAWS will be paid \$1 - \$12 for laser cartridges.
